



Volunteer Position: Graphic Designer

Period of traineeship: Minimum time of three months.

Job role:

The Global Development Foundation (GDF) volunteer will work directly with GDF in a role as a full-time graphic designer in conjunction with one of its partner NGO's. The role primarily involves working directly with GDF and GDF partners within the Delhi area.

The graphic designer will produce visual solutions to the communication needs of GDF's partners, using a mix of creative skills and commercial awareness. You will need imaginative flair, awareness of current fashions in the visual arts, working knowledge of the latest computer packages and an understanding of material costs and time limits, all of which can impact on the design.

Responsibilities:

- meeting GDF partners to discuss their needs;
- interpreting the partners business needs;
- developing design briefs by gathering information and data to clarify design issues;
- thinking creatively to produce new ideas;
- using innovation to redefine a design brief and meet the constraints of cost, time and client;

Skill requirements

- Professional graphic design qualifications
- multi-tasking: graphic designers often work on more than one design brief at a time;
- knowledge of a wide range of media, including photography and computer aided design;
- proven accurate and high quality work;
- Abreast of developments in IT, particularly design programs.
- To be able to work well in a team, with printers, copywriters, photographers, other designers, account executives, website designers and marketing specialists;
- To be able to work to tight deadlines.
